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#### **FUNDRAISING**

### **More financial challenges for Hive!**

Part of the Listed Building Consent for the Hive Community Hub is the requirement that a survey be done of the current heating system with recommendations for replacing this with something more suitable, especially for the Joy Abbot Hall. Until the radiators are removed and the pipework re-designed in there the pews cannot be taken out, which means that the other changes needed (levelling the floor etc) cannot happen. So changes to the heating were always on the 'to do' list.

However, last winter we had issues with the 30+ year old gas boiler down in the cellar and, on inspection, it was clear that the boiler is now beyond further repair and may fail without warning. So Hive faced more funding challenges again this year.

We set to and invited quotations from heating companies to undertake the survey work and prepare recommendations on the changes needed to keep the building heated.AJ Energy from Colchester were chosen as the company to do this work.

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In view of the costs and the fact that Friars Hall and the adjacent rooms are used most often by community groups, the Trustees have decided to go ahead with installing a new heating system just for Friars Hall (the work on the Joy Abbott Hall will be taken forward later). Quotations were invited a few months' ago for the new system and these have now been considered by Trustees and a contractor chosen.

The next challenge – as always – is finding the funding to meet the costs of the work – likely to be in the region of £35,000. Alongside Hive's own fund-raising for the new heating system, mainly from lunch-time and evening concerts and generous donations from members of the public, grant applications are being made for the money needed.

We hope to keep the current boiler working for as long as possible until the new system can be installed but have emergency plans for heating, just in case the boiler stops working before the new system is in place.

### Trustees Roles and Responsibilities (can be half day or a whole day)

It covers eleven areas of your work including governance, planning, user involvement, finance, resources, partnership working and so forth. Come and find out more about this standard which has been met by hundreds of charities.

### Managing Productive Meetings (Half day course)

Find out how you can make your meetings – trustee, staff or other meetings - more productive, constructive and meaningful. From setting agendas to developing good chairing skills this session could transform the way you hold your meetings.

### Writing good minutes (Half day course)

Minute taking is rarely taught and yet we waste time writing minutes that are often not read and are far too long. This course helps you to concentrate your minute taking on what is important and keeping them short and concise, thus saving you and others time.

## Are you a subscriber to X?

Charities are being urged to cancel their subscriptions to X (formerly Twitter) because of the deluge of racist comments and misinformation on the site. It is claimed that X is not doing enough to take action.

## Are you allowing your volunteers greater flexibility?

Charities need to be thinking about providing their volunteers with greater flexibility, particularly in the hours that they work and in providing volunteers with opportunities to work ad-hoc hours. The average age of volunteers is beginning to fall – for example the British Heart Foundation has found that its volunteers now have an average age of 30, rather than the average age of 50 before Covid. Younger people tend to want to volunteer at times that suit them.

### New codes coming in for 2025.



Two of the best-known codes of practice are set for changes in 2025. The Fundraising Regulator has published a revised draft of the Code of Fundraising Practice which is now out for a final consultation, running for 8 weeks until November 1st. It is now expected to be more user friendly. By visiting the Fundraising Regulator website you can read more and express your views. Meanwhile, the Charity Governance Code working party has recently finished its consultation on publishing a new version of the code due out in early 2025.

# First Local Authority issued with a Charity Commission Warning



Calderdale Metropolitan Borough Council is the first local government authority to be issued with an official warning from the Charity Commission. It runs thirteen different charities and has failed to file accounts for any of them for several years. It seems that the local councillors do not understand their responsibilities in relation to running charities.

Around 1200 charities (such as parks, gardens and buildings) in England and Wales are governed by local councils. The Charity Commission has written to all councils reminding them of their duties.

### Recent research reports both gloomy and positive

Recent research suggests that a third of charities expect their finances to deteriorate this Autumn as demand for their services grow. 18% of charities expect to cut their services due to rising costs, and many organisations report facing recruitment difficulties. At the same time other research findings published recently suggest that one in six wealthy people in this country could afford to double their donations to charities. If they were to do so, this could result in another £2.8bn coming into the sector! If you have any wealthy donors, treat them well!! On a more positive note, public trust in charities is at a ten year high!

A privacy notice lets people know what information you have and what you'll do with it. It's never been easier to make your own privacy notice, and having one is a great way to show people you can be trusted with their information.

The Commissioner has replaced its privacy notice template with a quick and easy generator tool to help you create a bespoke privacy notice in just a few simple steps. This brand new tool has been designed for sole traders and start-ups, as well as small and medium-sized businesses and charities to help make sure your organisation is compliant with the law.
